Pastor Sue's Letter

Lent.

Yes, I said it.

Lent will be here before we know it. February 14 to be exact.

It's time to put away the Christmas decorations, turn off the Christmas lights, blow out the white Christmas candles and light the purple Lenten candles. It's time to take one last look at the baby in the manger and focus on the man who walked the dusty roads of Galilee into the crowded city of Jerusalem to the deserted hill of Golgotha where he was crucified and died.

It's time to focus on why Jesus did that and what it means for us today.

Ash Wednesday is February 14th. We will have two worship services (11 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.) with the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

Each Wednesday after that we will gather at 7:00 p.m. for a brief worship service. The topic I have chosen is *The Way* by Adam Hamilton. It is a video-based series. Pastor Hamilton takes us to Israel to show us the very places Jesus walked, talked, preached, and lived. Each week we will watch a short video about Jesus' life, followed by a brief sermon. The topics are:


