



## Pastor Sue's Newsletter Article 2024

Having spent nearly 3 weeks in Lutherstadt Wittenberg, Germany, preaching at both the Town Church and the Castle Church, wandering through the historic streets where the Protestant Reformation began in 1517, was an incredible experience.

There was one part of history in that beautiful town that I want to lift up, because it is not such a beautiful part of history at all. But it is necessary and important to remember.

As I walked down Collegian Street, Market Street, and Thomas-Muntzer Street, I saw these small brass plaques with the names of people engraved on them. As I looked closer, I realized these were "Stumbling Stones" or *Stolpersteine*. They are to help people of all times to never forget the horrible crimes of the Nazi Regime, who took people from their homes, deported them to concentration camps and murdered over 6 million people they deemed "less than." Below is an article from German Missions in the United States: *Stolpersteine*— *Stumbling Into History*.

Scattered throughout Europe, planted in the streets and sidewalks of cities whose past is not forgotten, commemorative brass plaques eternalize the lives that were lost in the great tragedy of the 20th century. Called the Stolpersteine (in English: "stumbling stones"), the shiny bronze plaques commemorate the victims of the Nazi regime in more than 1,100 locations in 17 European countries.

More than 45,000 of these stones are solidly rooted across cities in Europe, including 916 places in Germany alone, where large strides have been taken to memorialize Jewish life, history and culture. Each Stolperstein commemorates a victim of the Holocaust at that person's last known address. The plaque includes the victim's name, date of birth, deportation date and death date, if known. In Berlin, more than 5,000 Stolpersteine have been carefully implanted in the city's sidewalks and streets, serving as a constant reminder of the many valuable lives lost tragically during the Holocaust.

But unlike many museums, the stones specifically pay tribute to individuals – names that can too often be forgotten when focusing on the sheer number of victims the Holocaust accounts for. Standing before a stumbling stone in a vibrant neighborhood in Berlin, the world comes to a stand-still as the engraved name of a single individual triggers an empathetic reflection of the life that might have been lived on that very street.

Multiple stumbling stones are often found on the same street, marking former locations of deportation. They therefore put into question what has often been said by many Germans – namely that they didn't know what happened to their next-door neighbors who suddenly vanished. The Stolpersteine are a project initiated by German artist Gunter Demnig, who strives to bring back the names of the millions of Jews, gays, Gypsies, and politically or otherwise persecuted victims who were either killed by the Nazis between 1933 and 1945 or driven to commit suicide.
