

Pastor Sue's September 2024 Newsletter Article

A man asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while traveling came upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. (Luke 10:29-34)

"Someone once asked anthropologist Margaret Mead what she considered to be the first evidence of civilization. She answered: a human thigh bone with a healed fracture found in an archaeological site 15,000 years old. Why not tools for hunting or religious artifacts or primitive forms of communal self-governance?

Mead points out that for a person to survive a broken femur the individual had to have been cared for long enough for that bone to heal. Others must have provided shelter, protection, food and drink over an extended period of time for this kind of healing to be possible.

The great anthropologist Margaret Mead suggests that the first indication of human civilization is care over time for one who is broken and in need, evidenced through a fractured thigh bone that was healed."

This story is told by Ira Byock, an authority on palliative medicine, in his book *The Best Care Possible: A Physician's Quest to Transform Care Through the End of Life* (Avery, 2012).

People for thousands of years have been trying to figure out how to live together in peace, how to care for each other and one's own self. We are all broken in some way because of the reality of sin that invades our lives. No one is exempt from its effects. But we can be healed, we can be made whole through the love and forgiveness of Jesus. It is important to embrace our brokenness, to take it to the Lord, and to live in the beauty of God's forgiveness. We can also help each other heal from the tragedies and traumas that have taken their toll, those things that have left others feeling broken. I hope we never walk by on the other side.

Some Fall and Halloween quilts will be sold between services September 22nd.


Some of the quilts will be raffled off during the bazaar in November.
